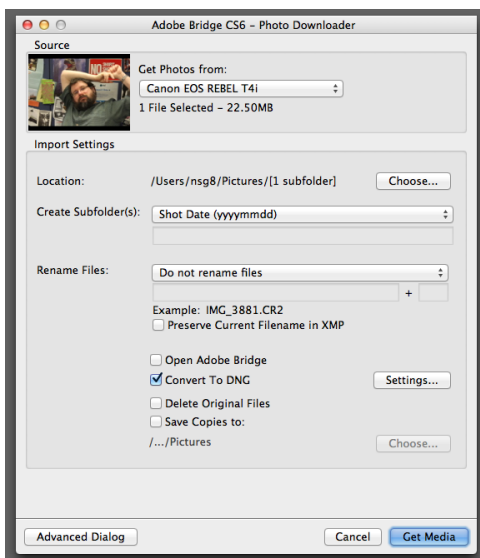
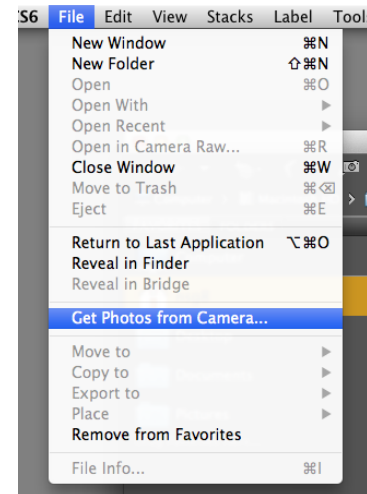


Importing and Converting RAW Files



Step 1: Open Adobe Bridge CS6 (dock icon shown at left). Use the search option in the upper right if the icon is not visible in the dock.

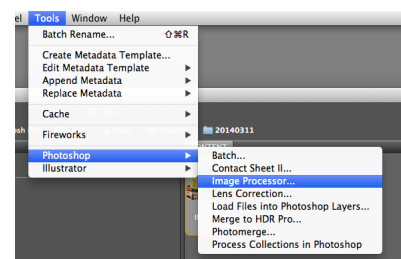
Step 2: Once Bridge is open and your camera plugged into the computer and turned on, select “File” at the top of the screen. Then, from the dropdown menu which appears, select “Get photos from camera (shown at right).

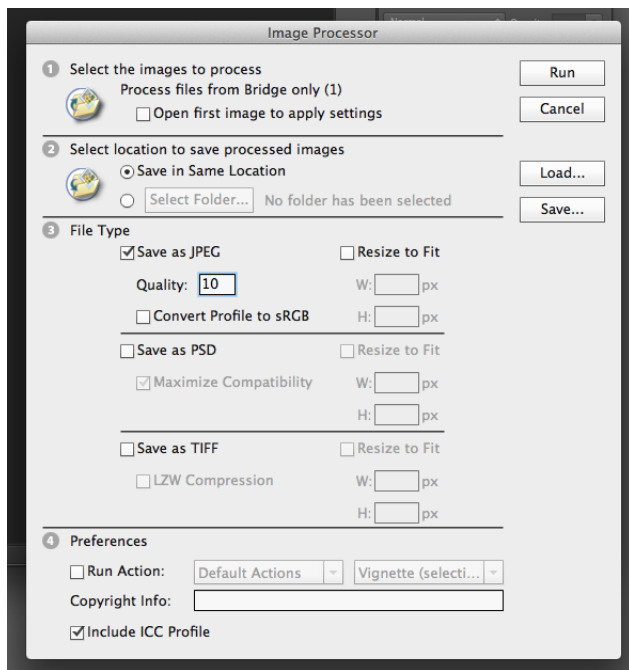


Step 3: A dialogue box like the one shown at left will appear. Once you have chosen where to save the imported files, and how they should be named after importation select “Get Media”. You may also find it helpful to check the box labeled “convert to DNG.” This will convert the proprietary RAW files into an open-source RAW file compatible with more software.

Converting to JPEG:

Step 4: Once you have edited your images in Camera RAW (if desired), highlight the images you wish to convert in Bridge. Then, at the top of the screen, select “Tools,” then “Photoshop,” and then “Image Processor.”





Step 5: Photoshop will open and a dialogue box like the one at left will appear. Here you can select the quality of the resulting JPEG files, a location in which to save the JPEGs, or choose to convert to PSD or TIFF in addition/instead. Once you have made your selections, click “Run” in the upper right.

Finalizing: When you have selected “Run,” Photoshop will proceed to open each RAW file and perform whichever conversions you have chosen. When finished, the resulting files will appear in the folder which you chose in the previous step.
